ANDREW WESA, age 76, of Royal Oak and Rapid City, MI, passed away peacefully on December 7, 2020 in Traverse City, MI. Born in Detroit, MI, he also grew up in Oak Park and graduated from Ferndale H.S. in 1962. He was the beloved husband of Joan (Dienes) Wesa for 52 years; the devoted father of Amy Wesa and Lorrie Wesa; and proud grandfather of Fiona Wesa-Cox and Aiko Tsutsui. He served his country in the Army during the Vietnam War. After his retirement, he spent many wonderful days Up North by beautiful Elk Lake while continuing to enjoy his family and friends around his long-time Royal Oak residence.
