



## Rita Lesko Simons

April 11, 1921 - June 30, 2019

Beloved Rita Lesko Simons passed away with peace and grace at the age of 98 on June 30, 2019, surrounded by the love of her family.

Rita lived a full life as a vibrant and warm mother, grandmother, wife, sister, daughter, aunt, and friend. Born into a large and loving family in Royal Oak in 1921, she enjoyed a pleasant childhood that would inspire her deep love of family and gratitude for life's simple joys. She married Foyle Simons in 1947, who preceded her death in 2005. She is survived by her daughter, Colleen; son-in-law Tom; granddaughters Holly (Gary), Tara, and Kirsten (Dan); great-grandchildren Justin, Grace, Kyla, Claire, and Jack; brother Mike; niece Kathy; and nephews Mark, Jim, Mike, and Paul.

A nurturing and gifted caregiver, Rita created a home that was a respite, rich in family traditions. After Foyle's passing, she began a new adventure at the age of 89, and shared her creative flair and lifelong connection to her community at the Royal Oak Historical Society, where she volunteered until her 98th year.

With a passion for life and an appreciation for everyday miracles, she enjoyed traveling, theater, reading, sunsets, and precious moments with the people she loved.

Rita was a wellspring of generosity, vitality, and kindness. She will always be remembered as a rare and cherished gift.

A memorial Mass will be held at St. Mary Catholic Church in Royal Oak on Thursday, August 1, at 10:00 AM, with visitation beginning at 9:30 AM. A luncheon will immediately follow at the Red Run Golf Club in Royal Oak. Memorial donations may be made in honor of Rita to St. Jude Children's Research Hospital, or to the Royal Oak Historical Society Museum.
