



Robert Ovies

September 17, 1938 - March 27, 2021

Robert F. Ovies passed into eternal life in his home surrounded by his family on Saturday, March 27th, 2021. Bob's life was marked by his faithfulness to God and his limitless creativity. He was born September 17, 1938 in Newark, New Jersey, the third child to Joe and Alice Ovies. He attended Shrine of the Little Flower Grade School and High School. He graduated from the University of Detroit and spent over 30 years working creatively at Campbell Ewald in the field of advertising. In 1970, he and his wife, Kathy served as missionaries at St. Catherine's parish in Window Rock, Arizona, the Navajo Nation capital. The couple later worked together in ministry at Shrine parish as founders of the Love of God Community where they housed and cared for people who were battered and displaced. They were leaders in the community of worship and faith.

Bob and Kathy spread the living Word of God to thousands of people through ministries they authored and shared within the Catholic church including both the Hungry for God and the Couple Prayer series which is still active in parishes throughout the world. Bob Ovies was ordained deacon in 1986 where he served in parishes in Southeast Michigan, speaking the Word of God through his homilies at mass, weddings, baptisms, and funerals. He was the Director of Detroit's Archdiocesan Offices for Family Life, Young Adult and Youth Ministries where he blessed couples and families through counseling. He authored four published books including *New Lives: A Testimony to God's Work in the Personal Lives of His People*; *Welcome to a Beautiful, Simple Miracle: Couple Prayer*; and two fictional novels, *The Rising* and *Barely a Crime*.

Bob expressed his love daily and freely to those around him, especially his family. Bob is loved and will be missed by his wife, Kathy, his five children, Theresa Regan, Jennifer O'Connor, Sarah Raudszus, John Ovies, and David Ovies. He is also loved and remembered by his sons-in-law, Patrick, Michael, Matthew, and his daughters-in-law, Laurie and Summer as well as his eleven grandchildren, Joshua, Jacob, Elizabeth, Liam, Joli, Isaac, Jane, Elena, Nathan, Alice, and Evarist. He is also remembered by his sisters Alice Finley and Elinor Ovies, as well as the many who loved him. Bob is joining the company of those who passed before him, his son, Mark, his brother, Joseph, his father,

Joseph and mother, Alice.

Jim saw in you what I have always seen in you almost right off the bat, a miracle had occurred because you invited us to come to this meeting. “ Bob and Kathy were and still are a rock for so many, including me. So many years of good memories of the two of them at St. Columban church, Bob as Deacon with homilies that showed he really was in touch with Jesus, and could help us see the present day reality and love of Jesus. And Kathy was so much a shining example of a real world person living the life that Jesus wants us all to live. She had boundless energy, patience, and love, especially with the children. And they all looked to her and would follow her around like chicks would their mother hen. All while telling the children how much Jesus loved them.

I remember some advice that Kathy gave me once: "It's better to be loving than right". I know she wasn't just saying that from a book. She lived it.

Bob and Kathy led a Life in the Spirit seminar that brought Jesus and God's word so much to life in the moment that it made Christianity attractive and appealing. I had a holy spirit moment at the end of that seminar. I remember a warm rush traveling through my whole body, and a wave of love that I wanted to give away to everyone around me. Bob was also the deacon holding the service on the day I entered the church. Also had a similar Holy Spirit moment as the re-baptism occurred.

I also was riveted and encouraged greatly for years due to a book Bob edited titled "New Lives". It captured the true conversion stories of over a dozen people local to Royal Oak and the Shrine church. He also wrote a column in the St. Columban bulletin for a year or so titled "Jesus Lives" that extended the book with additional stories of people's true God experiences, some of them documenting mini miracles. These stories held a lot of weight in my faith life. More than a decade later, I wanted to continue writing stories like that, and started the website WTNESS.ORG that now has about 60 such God stories from people I personally met who told me their stories.

I have no doubt whatsoever that the day Bob died, He was immediately greeted by Jesus who gave Bob a great big hug and said, "Well done, good and faithful servant! You have been faithful with a few things; I will put you in charge of many things. Come and share your master's happiness!" And I can also imagine that Jesus said, "Ask me for a favor! I would like to do something to show you my pleasure!" and Bob immediately saying, "Please send my beloved wife Kathy so much love and assistance that she won't even feel my absence."

God bless you, Bob and Kathy Ovies.
