Alexander Pal, age 58, of Royal Oak, passed away March 12, 2019.

Survived by his loving brother Gabriel Pal and his wife Takako Shigematsu Pal, his nephew Gabriel and niece Magdalena. Also survived by his beloved fiancée Charlene Govaere, her children Benjamin and Jasmine Govaere, and extended family in Hungary, Germany and Argentina. Predeceased by his parents Gabriel and Carolina Pal.

Alexander was employed as a mechanical engineer for General Dynamics, where he was involved in the development of the A-1 Abrams tank. He also was a tremendously talented painter and photographer, as well as a gifted musician, who wrote and composed his own music. A widely renowned Tango dancer, Alexander will be remembered for his passion and grace in the Tango community.

“ My last memory of Alex took place in December at Mary Duprie's Tango Studio. We sat on a comfortable bench as the soft music played in the background. It was the first time we had a full conversation in the language we both grew up speaking, Spanish. As always, I asked him how he was feeling and if he was eating. A question I asked him often whenever we saw each other. A couple of times I cooked for Alex. I made meatloaf and purchased tamales for Alex. My friend Jean Boyer took the food to him. I later asked her. "Did he eat the food? She responded, "He ate it all! I later found out that he was a vegetarian!

He never expressed frustration or appeared irritated in being asked the same repetitive question whenever we encountered each other. Instead, always with a smile he politely responded the same. "I'm doing ok."

You know, there was a time when I was upset with Alex. One evening, many years ago, I approached him and asked him why he never asked me to dance. He responded, "I will when you get better." I was so upset with him, but in retrospect, his comment made me become a better dancer. I was determined to prove to him that I could dance tango.

Months later, one evening Alex gave me a "Cabeceo" with a glint in his eyes. A "Cabeceo" is the signal a gentleman gives to a lady when asking for a dance. In astonishment I stood up and exclaimed, "Alex, you asked me to dance!"

He responded with just a few words, "I saw you dancing with Danny, referring to Daniel Moreno, a Champion Tango Dancer. I felt like I had just walked across a commencement stage and received my diploma. I was no longer upset with Alex.

That last evening in December we spoke about tango. It was apparent that his passion for the dance had not faltered. The beauty of Tango is that it represents the connection we feel as men and women. As human beings. Alex connected with so many people as I felt connected with him that evening when we spoke in a language we both loved. Rest in Peace Alex. Descanse en Paz, Alex. Even though our spiritual beliefs were different, I feel that when we meet again he will respond. "I'm doing ok."
