“ I was always close with my mom from the day I was born until the day she died. However, the day that I realized just how fortunate I was to have her for my mother occurred in kindergarten. We were on a field trip to a farm. All the children, myself included, were excited and having a great morning seeing the cows, chickens, and goats. The teachers directed all of us to an idyllic meadow where we sat in a circle to eat our lunches. Every child had brought their own lunch from home and we were all very hungry. There was one child who had no lunch. She was the child who never did her homework, never had school supplies, and needed a bath more often than she was given one. While I was munching on my peanut butter and jelly sandwich I watched with wide eyes as my mother gave her lunch to my little classmate. In my five year old mind, I could not imagine why she did that. But as I saw my classmate devouring my mom's lunch and I saw my sweet mother's look of satisfaction at having been able to feed my friend, I knew what a gem of a mother she was. In one gesture, she taught me empathy, love for others less fortunate, self-sacrifice, generosity and kindness. Even though I was only five at the time, I was cognizant of the significance of what I was witnessing, and it enveloped me with love that felt like a warm blanket on a cold winter's night.
