Barbara Harrington Nancarrow died October 21, 2015 at the Sanctuary at Mercy Bellbrook, Rochester Hills. She was 91 years of age, born March 24, 1924 in Detroit to the late Max Houghton Harrington and Ruth Eleanor Eaton.
