In 1950, he went to serve his country in the United States Army. He held the rank of Sgt. Major and was a member of the 2nd Armored Division "Hell on Wheels", during the Korean War.

Charles and Dorothy moved to Michigan to find work in the auto industry. He was employed at Ford Motor Company for five years and then he was hired at General Motors, Fisher Body #21, as a tool and die operator, where he retired at 55 years of age.

He loved his home in Westland since 1956. He was considered quite the handyman and carpenter, assisting with constructing his upstairs addition and other home improvement projects his family dubbed Charles the "King of Formica", and his children were his assistants.

He enjoyed playing slow pitch softball Union Local #157; he was nominated MVP due to a "No Hitter" in slow pitch in 1970 winning 100 games. In his younger years, he tried out as a pitcher for the Brooklyn Dodgers in New York. He was an avid fan of the New York Yankees. He had the opportunity to attend Super Bowl XXIII in Miami.

A man that loved to cook when he had the time made a delicious meatloaf and loved making one of our Christmas Eve traditions, kugelis, the breakfast of Lithuanians. After his retirement, Charlie enjoyed golf, tennis, fishing, basking in the sun, collecting and playing vinyl records and compact discs consisting of his favorite "Crooners" of yester year. A devout Catholic, he was a longtime parishioner of St. Damian Catholic Church, and a CYO member.

Charlie enjoyed having lunch with his family and friends. He was thankful for his loving and supportive wife and family. A quote from his 90th birthday celebration, "I am one lucky guy, with this beautiful family, Unbelievable!" I love all of you.
