“ My condolences to Mr. Lesher's family. I know you will hold his memories dearly. Mr. Lesher was my 6th grade science teacher, and absolutely the best teacher I ever had. I don't remember being tested or judged on how many facts I remembered or questions I answered on a quiz - but I do remember how he encouraged my interest in science from chemistry to astronomy, always providing extra materials and books for whatever I showed interest.

I do especially remember how he was generous in sharing with me materials for the home laboratory I set up - even though some of those materials were rather hazardous - like sodium (explosive when mixed with water <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=STeJV2hdQs>) and magnesium ribbon (super flammable <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Rnblw1ohNC8>). He trusted me - and I didn't burn down the house in Huntington Woods! And even when I was off to Norup I went back to Mr. Lesher to discuss what experiments I could do.

There is no question in my mind that it was from Mr. Lesher's 6th grade science class that I went off to study science including at the Berkely High Science Research Project where we were building a cyclotron through getting my PhD from MIT in computer science. And I was definitely channeling Mr. Lesher when I started doing experiments with my daughter (of course no sodium or magnesium on her own!) leading (I think directly) to her PhD in Applied Physics from Harvard. And of course in just the last few weeks I did experiments with my 6-year old granddaughter making organic bioplastics (from just glycerin, gelatin, cornstarch, and vinegar) molded into little toys and then extracting her own DNA (one of her favorite songs <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=ZK6YP1Smbxk>).

I was just one of thousands of Mr. Lesher's students - on behalf of them all - Thank You and Bless You
