



Donald R. Scheid

November 21, 1948 - February 2, 2025

Donald Raymond Scheid, age 76, of Royal Oak, passed away on February 2, 2025. He was born on November 21, 1948 in Highland Park to Raymond and Jean Scheid.

Don grew up in Royal Oak, attending St. Dennis Grade School and St. Mary's High School. After graduating, he continued his education at Oakland Community College, where he played baseball, before earning his bachelor's degree from Wayne State University.

A lifelong athlete and natural coach, Don dedicated many years as the athletic director for the Boys and Girls Club of Royal Oak. His coaching career spanned over 50 years, covering baseball, football, basketball, and girls' softball. He mentored athletes at various levels, including City of Royal Oak teams, travel teams, Dondero High School, and later Royal Oak High School, where he also worked as a hall guard for about a decade.

Outside of coaching, Don was an avid reader, card player, and golfer-though he wasn't above a little creative scorekeeping in either game. He had a deep appreciation for Westerns, especially anything starring John Wayne, and counted Louis L'Amour among his favorite authors. A devoted sports fan, he followed the Lions and Tigers faithfully, enjoyed watching M*A*S*H, and never outgrew his love for Motown music. In his younger years, he relished time spent fishing, hunting, and camping with his children.

Don's tastes were simple but distinct-he loved a good bar burger and had a weakness for black licorice, candy corn, and soft pretzels. And his sharp wit and signature "Don-isms" made him a memorable presence in any conversation, leaving a lasting impression on all who knew him.

Don will be remembered as the loving husband of his late wife, Mary Lou, who passed away last October. This year would have marked their 52nd wedding anniversary-a testament to their enduring love and partnership. 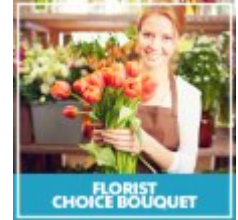

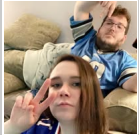
