*Although we are first cousins, I've always thought of Doug as a “big brother”. Life brought us together for a while, then apart back and forth over 6 decades.*

*In the late 1950's when I was somewhere between the ages of 5-6, both of my parents had to work to make ends meet, so I had to be 'outsourced' for care. Fortunately (for me,) it was also when families supported and helped one another, so my Aunty Irene (Doug's Mom) agreed to do it.; provide care for me. As an “only” child (at the time) I was happy with the arrangement because it came with Doug, who was four years older...kinda like a big brother.*

*Doug was always kind and patient with me. I clearly remember the time he save my life! We were at Metro Beach on a hot summer's day. I don't remember how I ended up under water, but I do remember being unable to breath. Doug reached in and pulled me out of the water and back to the beach. We rested for about 2 minutes and as soon as I caught my breath, we were back in the water and having fun!*

*Through our growing up years, we would connect on Sunday visits to our Grandparents house, and always for Christmas and New Years, but as life took us in different directions, our paths continued to intersect. Ironically, we landed in the same accounting class at Wayne State University where Doug excelled. I wasn't so inclined. Doug beat me out the door (graduated) ahead of me, but he spent time coaching (tutoring) me, and a year later I made it through my accounting requirements so I could graduate.*

*After graduation we once again on separate life and career paths. Doug was in a life transition and found himself alone for a period our younger adult lives. Terri and I were newly married, so we welcomed Doug into our home where we shared conversation, dinner (thanks to my gracious wife,) and a few beers; until he met*

*Becky! Needless to say, we were equally (or perhaps even more than) delighted when Becky entered his life!*

*Two decades later, now with a family and mortgage, storm clouds came into our American dream life as I was caught up in a corporate restructuring, and 'set free'. As I was in the process of considering my next steps, once again, Doug and I connected. He was employed with Volkswagen, and knew of a position that might be a fit for me. He delivered my resume on the hiring managers desk, and within a week, Doug and I were back together. and having fun in the work place. During a meeting break we stood side by side and casually mentioned we were twins. Referencing the movie TWINS with Arnold Swartzleniger and Danny Divito, we casually mentioned that the movie was really based on the lives of the two of us. We established "plausible credibility" by complimenting one another's part of our story that included pieces of our history only family would know. Some of the "old world" Germans (who lacked much of a sense of humor,) would walk away in a kerfuffle and then ask their American colleagues how that could be (true). Doug enjoyed those times. What a brother!*

*In retirement, (although Terri and I relocated,) Doug and I connected a few times a year, as we both enjoyed spending time together at the range. We would have lunch, where he would take me through his photo album of his car collection as they were being restored and when on display at the various car shows. It was always a good time.*

*Thanks for being a brother. I look forward to spending time together when I get home.*
