Ernest Louis was born in Johnstown, PA. to John and Melba Sheldon, the oldest of 9 children. He joined the Army at the age of 18 and began his career in the Army Air Force. After meeting at the USO in Columbus, Indiana, Rusty was determined to see Ruth again. He did, and they were married July 18, 1943. Many letters passed between them while Rusty served in the 36th division, 141st infantry division from Texas with artillery and reconnaissance expertise. He participated and, by God's grace, survived very difficult battles: which include the Rapido River crossing in Anzio, Monte Casino, and the lost battalion battle. he came home to his pretty wife, Ruthie and had a blessed life. He decided to become a Lutheran, for most of his career. Mr. Sheldon enjoyed his job and service to the Christian church and schools. And after work, Dad would find the time to line his six kids up to keep them in line. Mom was thankful for this, Dad and Mom taught their children life lessons, often by example. R and R were a championship team. The integrity, faithfulness, trust, and love from them both were evident and all of his children appreciate the strong foundation we have been given. We all look to the future when we will be reunited through faith in Christ.
