Jim retired from General Motors, Fisher Body in 1983 after 31 years where he began as a UAW Journeyman Toolmaker and later became a Senior Production Engineer and Senior Manufacturing Project Engineer. He served in the United States Naval Reserve for eight years and was Honorably Discharged as an ETS3. Jim was a visionary in founding the City of Sterling Heights in 1968. He served as the first Mayor Pro-Tem. He continued to serve on the City Council from 1968 to 1977. A strong believer in the sanctity of life, Jim was instrumental in establishing Compassion Pregnancy Center in 1994. He acted upon the visions the Lord gave him and united with fellow Christians in this endeavor. A memorial service honoring the life and faith of Jim will be at 11:00 A.M.
