Fortunato "Frank" Agazio, age 73, a 45-year resident of Madison Heights, died November 22, 2009 at William Beaumont Hospital in Royal Oak. He was born September 22, 1936 in Detroit. Mr. Agazio served in the U.S. Army during the Korean War as a tanker in the 10th Mountain Division. He retired from the General Motors Tech Center after 38 years of dedicated service.
