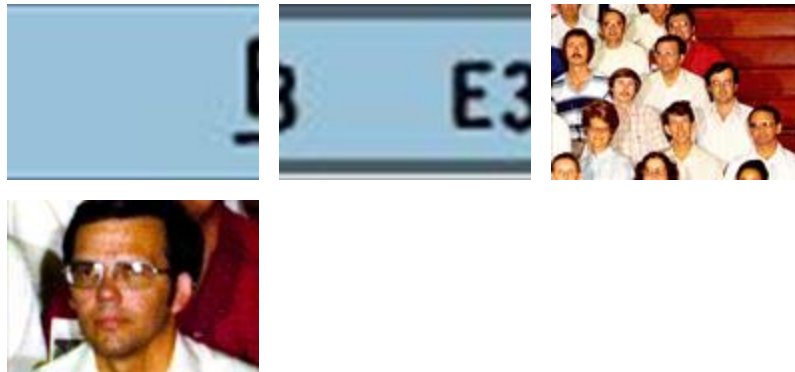
George's life will be privately celebrated on November 30, 2024 in Fort Walton Beach, Florida.
