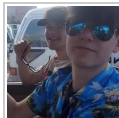

“ When I got the word that Greg had passed away I grieved for him and his family, I always will thinking of him on May 12, and Veterans day. Greg and I met in advanced infantry training in 1968 on May 12 1968 we flew on the same plane to Vietnam. We both were assigned to the First Air Cavalry B 1st of the 12th, Second platoon, gun squad. Our friendship became as close as it can get in the course of our combat experience, he was always ready to be my pal and often set me on course when I was going crazy over something or acting up after getting loaded. He experienced mortal combat and had many close encounters with the enemy and survived it all as did I, many of our comrades did not. We flew home together on May 12, 1969 via, Tokyo, Alaska, and then home. We parted our ways in the Chicago airport but never quit calling one another every once in a while, usually May 12 the day we returned and on Vets day. For the last few days I kept reminiscing about Greg and his gentle friendly way of dealing with others. Sometimes I can still hear his warm gentle voice saying "Jamsen, your acting crazy." It still settles me down. I'll always owe him my respect and gratitude for his close friendship and ability to be calm when it was most important.
