“From the bottom of my heart, I am saddened by the loss of my brother Greg. He made a commitment to God because he saw something in the sky on one of his walks.

He preferred walking when the weather was nice and would just soak things in. We would go camping once or twice a year he called it “Boot”. That’s what his Dad called it. When we would go out in the woods together the thing Greg liked the most was the peace and quiet, the nature of it all. I actually had the thought last week to set up a spring weekend camping trip when I get back to Michigan. I looked forward to it, it would have been nice since it would be the first camping trip since we were both Christians. I looked forward to good conversations about the experiences he has had while allowing God to guide his steps and being lead by the Spirit.

Not sure why he was taken, but I do know where he is going. Jesus said: in my fathers house there are many mansions (or dwelling places). I go before you to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you I will come again and receive you unto myself, so that where I am, you may be also. Greg knew where he was going and what his life finally meant.

Greg did not care about the number of days he had on this earth except to care for his loved ones and do the will of his Father in heaven. Jesus said: “Do not store up for yourself treasure in this life, which is here today, and gone tomorrow. But store up for yourself treasures in heaven. For where your treasure is, your heart will be also. Seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness and all these things will be added unto you.”

My brother Greg had many faults, weaknesses and troubles in his lifetime and he was the first one to tell you about them. He openly admitted his struggles. He also admitted that he could not possibly do anything good apart from Gods strength that he trusted in, and leaned upon.

He desired a family of his own and prayed about it often. I prayed with him for these things. He also told me he was being called to go into some rough places far away to tell people about what God had done for him. I actually worried that he was crazy enough to do it someday. But it didn't seem to bother him, and he said he would go where he was lead. He gave specific names of countries over in Africa. I think if he would have made it there, he would not have regretted doing it.

I will always remember about my brother the complete change that took place in his life as a result of having a relationship with Christ. Anyone who knew him can attest to that. He referred to his former days as "The Old Greg." And would even make jokes like "I almost went into Old Greg mode when someone was being a jerk or disrespectful.

He once gave a sermon in his church and focused on the topic of time. And I believe that time for the believer is irrelevant in heaven. I think it is possible that the next time I see him face to face it will be as if no time passed since the last time I saw him. My last words with him face to face were in prayer. He prayed for my family, my relationship with my wife and asked God to strengthen my heart, and to be bold in Christ. I remember every word he said. That's a good last face to face and I wouldn't choose anything different.

Greg reminded me of the Apostle Paul in many ways who once penned the profound words: "For me to live is Christ, to die is gain."

I will miss my friend and the life we had together as friends. But I will see him again. Goodbye brother. You not be forgotten. We will talk often.
