Harold Bernard Marble died peacefully on May 24th, 2024 at the age of 86 in the presence of his two children. Harold was the widower of Rosemary (Nellis). Harold was the father of Jeffrey Marble (Jennifer), Karen Marble Muzljakovich (Daniel) and the grandfather of Ryan Marble, Lauren Marble, Joshua Muzljakovich and Kate Muzljakovich. Harold was born in Detroit, Michigan on April 13, 1938. Harold was a man of many hobbies and talents. He enjoyed life! He obtained his ham radio license in high school and advanced to an Amateur Radio Extra license. He was a volunteer every year at the Ausable Canoe Marathon race, utilizing his ham radio expertise. He was an avid boater and especially loved the inland waterway in northern Michigan along with the Foote and Cooke dam waterways near Oscoda. He rode Harley Motorcycles and was even known to have hit a deer on his bike and kept on going! He had a general aviation license and enjoyed flying his Cessna 150 and later Piper airplane out of the Pontiac airport. He built a woodshop and enjoyed making cabinets and furniture.
