“ Our lives have suffered a big void as of Wednesday morning, when we lost one of the kindest, most accepting, caring, understanding, and loving people our family has ever had the good fortune to know. Jacquie came into the AndrewsÆ family life more than 14 years ago when she responded to a Macomb Daily ad placed by two parents looking for a caring, babysitter with dependable transportation to watch their 3 young kids in their home. Not an easy search. The first candidate didnÆt have a reliable car. The second was strung out on Lithium. IÆll never forget how excited Beth was to call me at work in the midst of JacquieÆs interview to tell me to come home. ôI think weÆve really got a great one hereùcome home right now and talk to herö. She said she loved kids, and wanted to continue to be with young children, now that her own kids were growing up. We thought, ôwe can fill that need--with 9 month old Charlie, 3 year old Leah, and 5 year old Davidö. At the time, of course, we could never have imagined what an important part of all of our lives Jacquie and her family would become. When we hired her, we were hoping to get a dependable, caring baby sitter. Never did we expect an arts and craft teacher, math tutor, child psychologist, nurse, grief counselor, housekeeper, cook, mover, and chauffeur all bundled in one that would follow us along our changing course of life. As David so aptly said through tearful eyes on his way home from college on Thursdayùöshe was always there for us--no matter what. She was like having a second mom.ö Plus, we got an added bonus, the entire Frost family. Criss was energetic and helpful beyond belief. There is nothing he doesnÆt know how to do, and best yet, is willing to do cheerfully, usually without us even asking. Their kids are greatùalways willing to let us be included in their busy lives. It has always been fun being invited to be a part of their family activities. Jacquie always made us feel part of their family. What we got in October, 1990 was a new ôbestö friend and her family. The reason Jacquie was loved so much was because she was so loving toward all, and always willing to accept them as they were. She always saw the best in everyone. We extend our greatest sympathy and condolences to all who were fortunate enough to have been born into her family, married into her family, or others like us, who

have been adopted into her family. All of us, whether we call her Jacquie, Baby, Mom, Sue, or Susie, are better people for having known her and had her be a part of our lives. No one can take away our treasured memories of her, and all she did for us. We will miss her every day, but also remember every day how our lives have been enriched by her loving friendship. I wish I had some answers for you, but alas, I don't. I'm wrestling too, trying to understand some of the events that the Lord has allowed into my life. As I've prayed, mourned, and sought answers, I keep getting the same simple message from Him... "Trust Me". It sounds so simple, and yet it is so hard. But the truth is, the place that you find yourself in now is the trial of your faith that Peter speaks about. I know. I've been there. I am there. And I struggle, just as you do, trying to make sense out of a senseless loss. It doesn't make sense, however. And there doesn't seem to be any rational formula to the Lord's decisions. Some of the Godliest people I know are the poorest, with the most heartache, and seemingly endless trials. While others, who seem to take the Lord for granted, skate along unscathed. It just doesn't make sense. And that is where our trust comes in. Can we trust Him when we can't see what He is doing? Or can we only trust Him as long as His purpose is presented to us and approved? I find myself leaning towards the latter and I hate that. It is hard to trust Him blindly. It is very hard. But along the way we find others, like yourself, that endure the same struggle, and I take comfort in that - because I know I'm not alone, and that He is working out His purpose in me...in you...in us. And somehow we will survive, and someday we will understand. We just don't have enough information now. We just can't see the big picture. There are too many variables, too many "what ifs", too many scenarios that could play themselves out. And there is no way that we could possibly follow all of them to their conclusions. Only He can. Let me close by sharing with you something that the Lord told Evangelist Billy Kelly when his wife was diagnosed with cancer. Billy couldn't eat - couldn't sleep. All he could see was his wife lying in that casket - and he was beside him self with depression, fear, and tormented by turmoil. He said the Lord spoke to him on a hillside while he was praying, and told him*

three things: "I've never made a mistake. The reins are in my hand. And everything is running on time." I hope, my family and friends, that these words comfort you as much as they do me. Please know that I am praying for all of you and your families, and if you ever need me, I am there for you. He is Lord and worthy of our trust.
