Jean Schneider (Chapman), age 94, February 18, 2021.

Jean was born July 19, 1926 to Harold and Mildred (Reid) Chapman in Berkley, Michigan. The oldest of 7 children, she graduated Berkley H.S. in June 1944. She married Richard Schneider June 22, 1946. They were married 49 years, 11 months and 20 days, until his death. She is survived by their 3 children, Bruce Schneider (Carol), Jonnie Lee Miller (Rev. Steve) and Nancy Regetz (Tom), also 12 Grandchildren, and 23 Great Grandchildren.

Preceding her in death, were both parents and 3 siblings, Paul (infant brother), Barbara Blake and Art Chapman. She is survived by brothers Glenn, Chuck, Butch, and Ron. She was also 'Auntie Jean' to more than 30 nieces and nephews, their spouses, and many others that just called her that.

Jean was a true 'Homemaker'. She and Rick built their little bungalow on Linwood Avenue beginning in 1950 and continued to live there and made improvements until her health forced her to enter into Assisted Living in 2017.

She was a member of St. Paul Lutheran Church in Royal Oak from the time of her marriage until her passing. Funeral services will be held there Saturday, February 27, 2021 at 11:00 A.M. Reverend Jakob Andrzejewski presiding.

The family will greet visitors beginning at 10:00 A.M. The service will be live streamed and the family encourages that under present conditions.

Interment will be at Glen Eden Cemetery, beside husband Richard.
