A memorial service will be held at a later date. Please check www.SullivanFuneralDirectors.com for updated service information and to leave a memory.

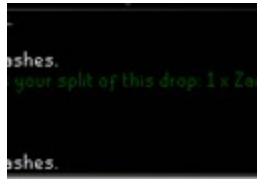
