She was a great, natural beauty. She was tall and lean, and had a calm, deliberate, confident walk you could recognize as her from a block away. As a young adult, Judy was a hard and diligent worker, excelling in her career as a law office secretary, and later in retail management. She gained a reputation as a trustworthy employee who would go above and beyond her job description, and as a smart and funny problem solver. She could always find a way to make any environment more efficient, more beautiful, and happier. Judy was a Michigan girl, through and through. She loved being outside in nature and took full advantage of everything each season had to offer. Boating, fishing, gardening, camping, hiking, hunting, ice fishing. She loved everything outside, no matter what time of year. She loved to travel to the tropics where she would snorkel, scuba dive, and sip tequila drinks by the palm trees. Judy was a wonderful cook and a welcoming hostess. She loved entertaining and all of the prep work that went along with it. The last 15 years of Judy's life were riddled with many hard challenges and health crises. There were six major, life altering surgeries and long recoveries.
