Kathryn C. Hancock, age 96, of Farmington Hills, passed away October 25, 2017 at Evergreen Health and Living Center in Southfield. She was born August 16, 1921 in Detroit to the late John and Clair Gillies. Kathryn was the beloved wife of the late Jack L. Hancock for more than 63 years; loving mother of Jack V. (Cathy) Hancock, Nancy Singleton, Greg Hancock and the late Jill Hancock; dear sister of the late Virginia (Roy) Hoke; proud grandmother of Wayne, Lindsey, Courtney and Andrew; great grandmother of six.

Kathryn took great pride in the fact that in the 1950's, while residing in Detroit, she worked tirelessly for numerous years for the Muscular Dystrophy cause obtaining countless volunteers to work 100 blocks each year. In 1958, she and eight others were honored at a reception at the Detroit Athletic Club, where the then Governor Swainson personally presented Kathryn and the others with merit awards for their efforts. Kathryn was an avid bridge player, a published writer, an ordained deacon, and member of the Covenant Presbyterian Church for more than 50 years. Kathryn absolutely treasured the Writers Group at Baptist Manor, which enjoyed occasional local media coverage, to share her latest piece and revel in the work of her fellow scribes.

She will be missed for her warm smile and her caring concern for her loving family and friends.
