“ My sister was an amazing person. Some of you may not know, but she was born with Cerebral Palsy. She under went many surgeries before I was even born just to earn the right to walk. Growing up with her was not very different from any other sibling relationship that I have witnessed, we laughed, we argued, we celebrated and yes we ran to Mom & Dad to settle disagreements. It was not until later that I realized what an absolute gift Kim was. Not to just our family but to everyone she encountered. Over the years people have shared stories with me of their time with Kim and how special she was to them. You have also never seen such an authentic laugh as Kim's once she got going. How many people have you ever meet that have only ever rooted for people? I don't think she ever thought ill of another person. Even to Kim's last days she would only tell you that you looked great, ask about your day, and legitimately care about everyone she loved. We did not tell many people about her condition but she was diagnosed with untreatable Pancreatic Cancer earlier this year. We did not tell many because we made the choice to not tell her. She thought she was being treated for jaundice. This may have been selfish, I don't know, but we did it to let Kim live to her fullest until the end. It was time to say goodbye on Saturday as the pain had grown significantly. Knowing Kim was a gift to Love her was to walk with Angels. I love you and your memory will never die. A friend sent me a note that nailed it. They said that I look to the day when I can know Kim the way God intended, without impairment, pain or suffering and full of light and joy.
