Lilla Cleo Upton Campbell, age 92, passed away peacefully at her home in Cedar Park, TX, on October 9, 2009. She was born in Sylvarena, MS on April 11, 1917, and at 15, moved with her family to Royal Oak, where she resided most of her life. In 1999 Cleo retired to Tucson, AZ, before moving to central Texas three years ago. Cleo was a member of the Royal Oak First Baptist Church for 75 years, and took great comfort in her faith. Cleo lived a rich, full life that revolved around her family and her church. She was enormously proud of all of her children and grandchildren.
