Luke Rondeau passed into the arms of Jesus on January 17, 2021, at the age of 84. His quiet and gentle spirit, his humble faith and his sweet sense of humor will be greatly missed by his family and many friends.

Despite all this, he was still actively involved in his church with Taya and his good friends. He loved to share jokes, often quoting one of his own favorite Luke-isms: "I can't wait until tomorrow -- I just get cuter every day!" Did we mention that Luke also LOVED his RED MUSTANG?

Luke is survived by Taya, his wife of almost 43 years, three children, Judy, Michael (Carrie), Bob (Illiana), five grandchildren, Cory (Mat), Chris, Tim,

Timothy and Matthew, three great grandchildren, Zachary, Kale and Owen, and two siblings, Claudette and Jisele (Dan). He is predeceased by his sister, Rose-Marie and his son, Timothy.
