Margaret (Marge) Mary Tebo (née Taube), 80, of Huntington Woods, MI passed away on December 25th, 2023. The Lord called upon her Christmas morning after a nearly 20-year-long battle with Parkinson's Disease.

Marge was born on March 8th, 1943 to Sylvester and Alice Taube in Detroit. She grew up as the 6th child in a family of 9; siblings include Mary, Catherine, Estelle, Sylvester, Jim, Basil, Titus, and Patricia. Love for helping her younger relatives led to a four decade career as a Special Education teacher. She spent 35 years in the Roseville School District before retiring in 2008.

In 1969 she met the love of her life, William Tebo IV. They married on May 7th, 1971 and raised their 5 children, William, Kenneth, Philip, Meghaen, and Alicya in Huntington Woods.

Marge was a parishioner of St. Mary's Catholic Church in Royal Oak, MI and served her community in a number of ways, including as a member of the church choir and a lector sharing the Gospel of the Lord.

Friends and family will remember Marge for her caring nature and patience, her sharp wit, and humor. She was an avid fan of the Detroit Tigers, a lover of all things chocolate, and enjoyed playing pinochle with her family.

Marge was preceded in death by her parents Sylvester and Alice, and her sister Mary. She is survived by husband William, her children William (Heather, grandson William), Kenneth, Philip, Meghaen, and Alicya.

Services will be held on Saturday, December 30th at St. Mary's Catholic Church, with a viewing at 9:30AM, followed by a Mass at 10:00AM. There will be a memorial celebration in the spring.
