“ I have many memories of Marilyn, at the Washington coast, baking Christmas cookies, but I think my favorite is when I took her to my favorite cabins on the Washington Coast for the first time and we went walking on the beach, which literally extended for several miles North and South. She was enchanted with the large flocks of shore birds that would suddenly take off, circle & come back only a few feet away from where they started, the amazing number of shells & sand dollars that we found and the waves. I had warned her about the waves sometimes coming in farther and faster than expected - sneaker waves - but she really didn't understand them until one came in. I saw one coming & told her she needed to move farther away from the waves ... she'd move a couple steps as I moved much farther, I told her again, & again she moved only a few steps. I had to grab her arm & pull her as the wave came dashing up to her feet, clearly surprising her as it covered her booted feet. It left us both laughing as we continued to enjoy our walk along the beach.
