He was found sitting at his computer during a wellness check. We hope this acknowledgment offers transparency and comfort to those mourning his loss.

He was born on May 21, 1955, in Lansing, Michigan, to Betty Jean Stebbins-Vallad and George Junior Stebbins. Mark was a quiet, thoughtful person, an introvert who found joy in his passions. His love for computers, gaming (game name tag: sigerocto), and movies reflected his curious and creative spirit. He served in the Air Force from 1987 to 1991 and worked at K-Mart Headquarters for 16 years, demonstrating dedication and professionalism. His interests and career reveal a person who valued knowledge.

The last 2.5 years of Mark's life were the happiest time of Mark's adult life. He became a resident of Royal Oak Manor in 2023, where a community of people supports one another. Mark had commented, within weeks of moving into his own apartment, that it was the first time he had his own bathroom and kitchen,

and that he was very pleased. During his time at Royal Oak Manor, he spent more time with people than previously. He became the "Computer Guy," sharing his computer knowledge and helping other residents with their computers & Smart TV's. He was considered a very kind and generous person and was well-liked.

He is survived by his sister, Kim Karlene Stebbins, and brother, George Scott Stebbins. He was preceded in death by both his parents, Betty Jean Stebbins-Vallad and George Junior Stebbins. Our thoughts and condolences go out to all who loved Mark during this difficult time.
