To his church. But mostly Bubba was loyal to people. He shared a friendship with David Henderson, staying with him through some trying times. But Bubba has touched a lot of us with his magic. Let's talk about magic. How did he ever find Carol? And she find him? I was with them when Carol was the Queen of the Court at Shrine in 1969. And I was with them when Bubba was inducted into Shrine Hall of Fame a couple years ago. He had the same dreamy look on both occasions. What a thing. I regret not have spent time with their sons and grandkids. I bet they turned out pretty good.

Bubba did very well, filling his life with a great family and friends. His magic brought people together, made them see the joy of life. He fought the good fight to stay with us as long as he could. “ All of us have a childhood, best friend when growing up but I was exceptionally lucky and blessed that Bubba filled that role in my life. My family moved to Fairlawn opposite the Glynn family in the summer of '61. Bubba was my classmate at Shrine Grade for two years prior and he became our (with brother, Chris) sponsor into the fantastic neighborhood that we just had become members. The neighborhood boys had team sports almost daily with plenty of participants and it was always fun to be on Bubba's team, but half the time you were opposing. One time, probably in sixth or seventh grade, Bubba and I were opposing team leaders playing baseball at the neighborhood lot. We just had a heated disagreement on the previous play and now I was at bat. Bubba served me a beautiful pitch that I really connected with. The ball went over the fence, through the Saranay motel's parking lot into Woodward. I ran the bases and when I stepped on home, here was Bubba charging me from the mound. I thought he was mad and wanted to “pound” me. Instead, he put out his hand and with a big smile congratulated me for a record homerun. That is how gracious a person he was, even back then. He later broke that record with his own blast that rolled across Woodward to Club Berkley's parking lot. As time went on we received our driver's licenses (now I could drive, legally) and I drove my brother Chris, Bubba, and sister Colleen to SHS in the morning. Bubba always came out the front door with his books in his hands and a slice of toast in his mouth. He would have the toast finished by 12 mile road and we would sing “King of the Road”, Sinatra's “That's Life”, “Love Potion No. 9” or whatever else was playing on the radio the rest of the way. I guess you could say I had a good childhood growing up (although I didn't realized it at the time) and Bubba was certainly, a large part of that. Thank you, Bubba. I could go on and on. I look at the web photo and see “the most interesting man in the world”, it is the same pose as the one for our senior yearbook that we rushed from the construction jobsite we were working just barely making the photographer's appointment. I don't remember if we even had time to shower, I don't think we did. Although there was a long period where we lost contact with each other through lazy neglect, I got the opportunity to tell him I loved
