Martin Anthony Stella, age 77, of Utica (previously of Macomb Township), passed away December 24, 2020.

Loving brother of Jordan (Jeanne) Stella and Richard Stella. Predeceased by his sister, Mary Cortese; his brother, Robert Stella; and his parents, Anthony and Mary Stella.

Martin graduated from the University of Michigan with a Bachelor of Arts degree, where he performed as a member of the marching band. He subsequently obtained a Master's Degree from Wayne State University. He then returned to U of M to obtain his Doctoral of Musical Arts, with the clarinet as his focus instrument.

Martin taught Music for forty-nine years at Macomb Community College, Center Campus. He was also the Band Director at the Metropolitan Symphonic Band and played the clarinet at Meadowbrook during summer festivals. In his spare time, he enjoyed playing the piano.
