



## Marvin J. Stayman

August 26, 1915 - November 19, 2012

Marvin J. Stayman, age 97, a 15-year resident of Clawson, formerly a 40-year resident of Novi, died November 19, 2012 at the American House in Royal Oak. He was born August 26, 1915 in Detroit to the late William and Rose Stayman. Mr. Stayman was a World War II U.S. Army veteran who served in the South Pacific. He owned and operated the Great Lakes Dental Laboratory in Detroit for more than 30 years. He was a lifelong organic gardener and an avid roller skater. He also was extremely interested in alternative medicine and reading articles on investments. He is survived by his children, Susan Ronald Stayman-Stempky of Clawson, Mary Stayman-Schenk of Allegan, MI and Joseph M.
