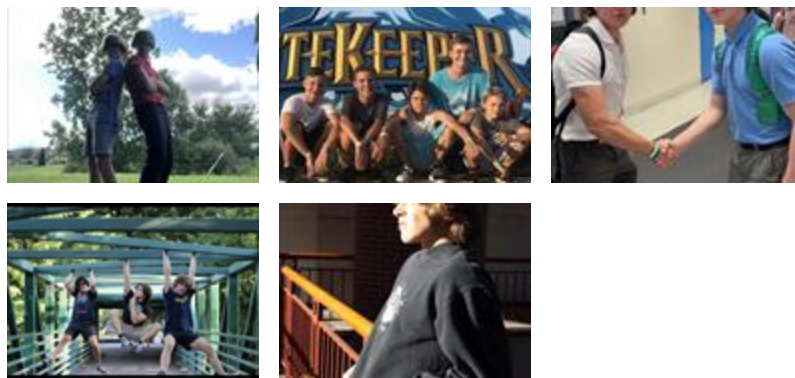

He was always confident and secure in who he was, I couldn’t even be mad when he would “talk back” because he was making such valid points and so calm during his delivery. He felt a real responsibility to look out for his siblings, they’d fight hard but they all have such a genuine love for each other.

What a pleasure to have watched that wild child turn into a wild young man. Throughout the years of baby sitting, lock ins, youth trips and activities, small groups, church picnics and hair cuts (he’d always sit in the mirror for several minutes after, switching his hair around until it was just right for him) etc etc. I got to watch Matty help lead worship several times, welcome new comers, try new things without any fear, stick up for those who needed it and grow in his faith- what a privilege. One of my favorite memories was when he got that little hedgehog, he was so excited to tell me and got a real kick out of how badly I’d always wanted one and how little I actually enjoyed holding it once I realized they really are spiky. I’m so grateful for all the random times I’ve bumped into him as he became a teenager and into his adulthood, just a few minutes for a hug and “how are you?” but he always took the time whether it was at cutting edge while I was chasing toddlers or at meijer and he was with his group of friends. Matty was the kind of kid that was so cool because he never felt like he was too cool for anyone. A one of a kind soul that left an impression on everyone he met. I find it so beautiful that even in such tragedy and loss, he still brought his joy and light to others through his gift of organ donation.
