Milton C. DuBay, 93, of St. Clair, MI passed away on Thursday, April 7, 2022. Milton was born on June 30, 1928 in Mount Clemens, MI to the late Percy Ignatius and Irene Marie (Wolf) DuBay. He married Carolyn Mae Lemma on August 16, 1952 at St. Peter Catholic Church in Mount Clemens, MI.

Education during the 1970s and was a proud member of the Old Crowd. Milton enjoyed spending time with family and friends, fishing, working on cars, and doing electrical projects. He was a skilled engineer and oversaw the construction of his home in St. Clair where he and Carolyn enjoyed their retirement years.
