Monica Kolly was born in Detroit, MI to Stephen and Florence Jankowski and attended Blessed Sacrament High School for girls where she was elected vice president of her class. She married Leonard Kolly just before he was deployed to the Pacific theater during World War II. During the war, Monica was employed by the War Department performing clerical work in Detroit. Upon conclusion of the war, she lived on Casimere Street in Hamtramck briefly and then moved to Royal Oak where she raised her six children.

She worked for extended periods at William Beaumont Hospital, Royal Oak and later at the Wayne Oakland Bank from which she retired.

She was long a member of St. Dennis Roman Catholic Parrish in Royal Oak and a member of its ladies Sodality.

With Leonard's retirement in 1980, they moved to Venice, Florida and, after

her husband's death, she moved to Deerfield Beach, Florida. She returned to Michigan permanently in 1986 and, for a period, worked for the Clinton Township Senior Center.
