Neal Andrew Waldrop Jr., age 92, passed away February 27, 2015 at Arden Courts of Livonia. He was born March 28, 1922 in Waverly, TN to the late Nealy Andrew and Etha Lura Waldrop. Mr. Waldrop served as an officer in the U.S. Navy during World War II. He received his bachelors of science in chemical engineering from the University of Tennessee in 1943 and his law degree from Wayne State University in 1950. He was the owner of Neal A. Waldrop & Associates, P.C. He was the president in 1967 of the Michigan Patent Law Association; president in 1970 of the Detroit Golf Club; member of the Masons Palestine Lodge No. 357 in Detroit since April 1954 and obtained lifetime membership in 1994; became a Knight Templar of Commandery No. 1 in Detroit in September 1963 and transferred to a Commandery in North Carolina in March 1994. Beloved husband of the late Helen A. Darst Waldrop. Loving father of Neal A. Vanessa Waldrop III, Stephen D. Waldrop, Philip G. Waldrop and Allison W. Mark Miller.
