Pamela Ann Michael, a lifelong musician, teacher, and mentor, died on May 19th, 2020 at the age of 73.

Pam was born in Detroit in 1946. She attended Cooley High School and then Wayne State University. An early foray into social work in Detroit's North End led to teaching music at the Detroit Waldorf School. From there she moved into the Detroit Public School System, first at Emerson Elementary/Middle School, and then Noble Middle School. 'Ms. Michael' guided a number of her students to the Detroit High School for the Performing Arts. Later she taught at MSU Community Music School in Detroit and then returned to where she began, the Detroit Waldorf School. Over the years she instructed hundreds of students, many of whom became her friends.

Pam had a lifelong passion for music and for encouraging her young students to find their own musical connections. She played professionally with the New Horizons Band in Saline and at community churches and venues. She identified with many aspects of Judaism and volunteered at the Holocaust Museum in West Bloomfield where she felt warmly accepted. She also felt a strong connection to Native American thinking. She loved movies, hiking and her cats but most of all she loved people. Pam was always ready to laugh and smile with anyone she met.

During what could have been her retirement years, Pam pursued a healthy lifestyle, sought new ways to help others, advocated for students, and enjoyed taking road trips. Even with her sudden, unexpected illness, she remained optimistic and focused on the needs of those around her. No one was prepared to lose her so soon.

She is survived by her son Miles Michael and many dear friends who considered her family.

A memorial will be planned at a future date to gather the people she held dear in celebration of her life.

“ I just found out last week of Ms. Michael's passing and it took me another week to have the strength to write this.

Ms. Michael was the foundation of my career as a music teacher. When I first started teaching string orchestra, I remembered everything that Ms. Michael taught me at Emerson Middle School. I didn't have consistent teachers to continue teaching me strings, since they were more focused on band. But those 3 years at Emerson were enough for me to know how to make my students sound amazing on any level. I owe that to Ms. Michael.

When I started a string orchestra program at a community center in Delaware, we didn't have a lot of funds to purchase new music. Ms. Michael sent me boxes of sheet music, some that I had even used when I was her student at Emerson.

Even just this past school year, I was given a position to revamp an elementary school band and orchestra program. I had confidence in the orchestra program, but I didn't for band. Most of my band career I taught or led groups that already knew how to play their instruments. I reached out to my amazing mentor, Ms. Michael, and she mailed band music to use for beginners that not only were doable, but sounded great. She taught me step by step on how to start a beginning band program from scratch. She told me to have patience when I heard those beginning instrument sounds and to just laugh with them. She knew me well enough to tell me that, because she knew that I didn't have a patient ear when it comes to music, lol. But I took her advice and did quite a bit of laughing the first couple of months especially lol.

That concert was a huge success and the spring concert was going to be even bigger (if we didn't have to close school). I owe it all to Ms. Michael.

Lastly, I will remember the days that she came to my dance recitals when I was in middle school, and she then began to take dance and invited me to a couple of her classes as a guest. I will remember her

smile, her laugh, her text messages for birthdays and holidays, and her gift not only in music, but in caring for all of her students as if they were her very own children.

Thank you Miles for sharing your wonderful mother with all of us.
