Pat was a beautiful person inside and out. She worked for a typewriter company who asked her to model for typewriter ads. Eventually she worked for W. J. Rewoldt Company where a little old lady took her under her wings and taught Pat everything about accounting. Pat continued with W. J. Rewoldt and ultimately became the COO of the company.
