June 2, 1919 - February 9, 2022

Reginald "Reggie" Telly, of Sterling Heights, passed away on February 9, 2022 at the age of 102. Reggie proudly served his country in the United States Army during World War II. While raising his family, Dad had a variety of jobs which included that of a draftsman. If he left a job, he would have another job by the end of the next day to support his family. He was definitely a go-getter and very responsible. He attended night school to earn his degree in engineering. Reggie was an entrepreneur and went on to develop his own grinding business along with his brother, Vic. They were in business many years and dad retired from that role in the early 1980s. Dad didn't stop there. I believe he was 62 years old at that time and he had too much more to do. He had better ideas.

Did you know that Reggie was an inventor? He designed and patented a few items. A half-notch for a watch band; a bowling ball insert; a case for precision gage balls,-- just to name a few that I'm aware of. I'm sure his kids will be happy to share his achievements with you. Dad developed his Precision Components business back in 1985 and worked this business up until about one year ago. I guess we could say Dad retired at the age of 101. Amazing! Dad liked to stay busy.

Dad was quite the Tiger Baseball fan. He attended his first Tiger game at Navin Field in Detroit and continued to be an avid fan throughout his years. Just think about all the changes he witnessed to the sport and the fields where the Tigers played.

Reggie was quite the fisherman. He loved to fish for walleye on the St. Clair River at night. Even if it meant going alone. He almost always came home with some big ones. Sometimes they barely fit in the refrigerator.

As a young man he was quite the ice skater and hockey player. He would join games with other guys and actually had the opportunity to play once with Sid Abel and Ted Lindsay from the Red Wings team.

Dad created an ice rink in his backyard for his kids and the neighborhood kids to enjoy. I am told he enjoyed it as much or more than the kids. Ten years ago he was asking about his hockey skates and thought about trying out the ice again! Probably a good idea that he couldn't locate them. But something inside me believes he still would have skated like a pro

Dad also spent some time in his early years bowling. That's probably where his idea for the inserts for bowling balls came into play.

As time went by, Reggie enjoyed many days of golf with family and friends. He enjoyed being in the outdoors and the competition with the guys. The guys would have to let you know just how good he really was!

As time went by he tagged up with some gentleman friends at the Warren Recreation Center and played billiards with the guys. He would joke and say he plays with the kids at the Center. They were in their 70s and 80s and much younger than Reg. It kept him going. He also had his special group of friends

who would meet regularly at Dunkin Donuts or Mcdonalds for coffee. Imagine the conversations and laughs at those gatherings!

What a joke teller he was. Wasn't he the best? I believe everyone in this room has heard at least one joke from Reg. Some were jokes he was sharing from years ago, other more recent and we can't forget the jokes he would make up. Of those he was most proud. He always made me laugh! I always enjoyed watching him laugh until he had tears running down his face. What a funny guy he could be!

Dad liked to keep his brain sharp. Over the last several years he challenged himself with Sudoku puzzles on a daily basis as a form of relaxation. Within the last couple of weeks he completed the 4th level. He's always been very good with numbers and had the patience to figure out anything.

Dad was a very good cook and an excellent host. Always quick to offer something to drink. A glass of water, pop, or maybe even a nice cold beer. Ice cream, pudding, or cake were typically available too. He was ready for anything. I think he was quite proud of the way he could put a meal together and make it taste so good. The best pea soup and baked mostaciolli I ever had came from his kitchen, made with his hands. We will miss his culinary skills.

Dad, we will miss you, along with the stories you shared and laughter you brought to each and every one of us. We all have been so blessed to have had you with us for so many years. I believe you know you were so loved especially with having your children at your side when you passed.
