July 14, 1949 - June 3, 2015

Bob Brinker, 65, of Sterling Heights passed away suddenly on Wednesday June, 3, 2015. Born on July 14, 1949 in West Branch, Michigan, Bob was a 30-year employee of General Motors Tech Center as a master plumber/pipe fitter. He held the positions of vice president and veteran chair for the UAW Local 160. He was also a member of the UAW Region 1 veteran's council and the Great Lakes National Cemetery. As a proud US Army Vietnam war veteran, Bob is survived by his wife Judy (Ficek); son Robbie (Kathy); daughters Teri Lynne and Kelly; grandsons Joey Brinker and Eric Hodge; sisters Char (the late Manny) Muns, Cathy (Charlie) Berger, Patty (John) Kimball and Sue (Harry) Schroeder; and brothers Rick (Cathe) and Dan (Paulette). He was "Favorite Uncle Bob" to many nieces and nephews. Bob is predeceased by his parents Bob and Mariette as well as his sister Nancy. Visitation will be held at Wm. 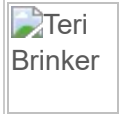

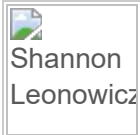

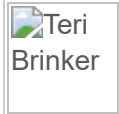
