April 7, 1948 - January 19, 2021

Robert “Bob” Leonard Sheldon, age 72, passed away suddenly late on January 19, 2021, while in his home.

Bob was born on April 7, 1948, to Dorothy and Fred Sheldon, in Detroit, Michigan. Bob was the oldest of three - the older brother of Jean Ivory and Carol Sheldon. Growing up in Royal Oak, Bob graduated from Dondero High School and later Michigan State University, where he earned a Bachelor’s Degree and a Master’s Degree.

While in East Lansing, Bob met Jackie to whom he married in 1978. Together, they had two sons: Greg and Mike. Bob passed his love of sports down to his sons, never missing any of their games. Bob even became the leader of the Parent’s Organization at Albion College where both Greg and Mike played football.

Later, Bob married Sharon and became the father of Juli. Bob and Juli were always off on grand adventures together. Bob embraced going outside of his comfort zone and trying new things whether it was doing a yoga class, sampling vegan cuisine or touring the Chicago skyline in a propeller plane.

For the last several years, Bob also enjoyed the company of his dear friend, Diann, and her family.

Between Bob's three children, he had six grandchildren (Isaac, Whitney, Jackson, Samantha, Lanie, and Benny) who he loved to spoil. Bob was known to travel to Chicago, Denver, and Austin at a moment's notice to spend time with them...and sneak them popsicles. During each visit, Bob would also knock out a long "To-Do List" of home improvement projects...whether he was asked to or not.

No stranger to hard work, Bob was known to put in 10-12 hour work days throughout his career and more recently, during his "retirement". Bob worked in residential and commercial real estate in the Oakland County area for over 40 years where he impacted countless families and businesses. Succeeding his dad, Fred Sheldon, as the steward of Berridge & Morrison, Bob guided the company into the new millennium and past the century mark. Bob was blessed to have a vast network of co-workers, contacts and friends to help him along the way, most notably, Rex Smith, his friend and business partner of over 40 years. Despite his success, Bob had a hard time spending money on himself but was extremely generous with friends, charities and loved ones. When Bob wasn't working, on nice days, you could usually find him on the golf course.

Alcoholics Anonymous also had an enormous impact on Bob's life as he found joy and freedom in sponsorship and fellowship with members for over 46 years.

Bob will be remembered as a kind and fair man who would do anything for his family and friends without ever asking for anything in return. His legacy will be as a hardworking man who was truthful, loyal, and a caretaker to all.
