Roger Andrew Leith, 62, beloved son, brother, uncle, and friend, passed away on Wednesday, February 5, 2025.

Roger was born on July 3, 1962, the fourth child of Phyllis and Richard Leith. He graduated from Berkley High School in 1981 and went on to serve proudly in the United States Marine Corps from 1982 to 1986.
