Loved you she did!! She cared for everyone whether family, coworker patient or friend. She was the real deal, genuine, funny, supportive, loyal, generous and giving.

I recall when she interviewed for her position at Beaumont. She told Trym and me that she had no experience, but she lived close by and always wanted to work at Beaumont and really thought she would be good at it. She did not want to be a secretary but wanted to work with patients. Well good at it she was. She told us often that she loved her job and loved working at Beaumont and had two great bosses!

Rosetta was a natural with patients and bonded with her coworkers very quickly. She often said this is my Beaumont family. She was a true team player. She was an ambassador of Beaumont and a dedicated member of Orthopedics 6 North and 9 North and eventually the wound clinic.

She really warmed the hearts of her patients and worked with so much energy and gave excellent care. I remember her putting on boots to bathe a patient who was on a Stryker frame in our large shower room. We almost had a flood, but she talked nonstop to the patient through the whole process even though large quantities of water surfaced. She laughed so hard and her laugh was infectious!! One weekend when I was scheduled to work and my dad m, who had dementia, was in the hospital, Rosetta and Ellie went to check on him. They bathed him and got him out of bed and had him laughing and singing to them!

When my daughter's old mustang was missing a floor in the front. She asked John to repair it. When John brought it back to us, it was spotless and he even returned two dollars worth of change he found

in the seat cushions etc.

Rosetta always wanted to help no matter what the task! For my wedding she volunteered to do a dessert table and had many people bringing desserts to her house. She transported abundant trays in 90 degree weather to the hall.

No matter what the event she wanted to do her part. For a reunion we planned in 2008 for staff who had

Rosetta surprised us by making feet and hands out of dough art and putting them on sticks they were put in flower pots filled with kitty litter and were used as centerpieces.

For the Joint Parade, Crooks and Rosetta helped me bake 200 cookies. As we were dividing them in small baggies, Rosetta said the rule was if a cookie dropped you could eat it. She intentionally dropped a few.

When we did a fundraiser by selling golf umbrellas with the saying "bone dry" Rosetta drew the bone for the company making the umbrellas. Julie Diss' husband made a mild if a femur for the umbrellas handle. Rosetta was top promoter and best seller of those umbrellas.

One day she called and talked to my husband who had just had a pacemaker put in. I was getting radiation treatments but working and my husband told Rosetta he felt bad because we were both so tired and hadn't gotten to clean up the yard. Rosetta and Ellie came over and trimmed our bushes raked old leaves and bagged everything up!

I treasure many things that Rosetta gave me thru the years, especially things she had made! I have a wooden Santa she painted for me and a snowman and a Raggity Ann doll and many old tree ornaments she took off her tree and gave to me.

I remember her cozy basement and her turquoise kitchen and all the things her home that had a history and story.

Rosetta was a patriot and had a huge flag pole in the ground in front of her home.

Rosetta took care of Hohn so well! Even though John said "Patches" was her favorite. I remember Rosetta was so sad that John passed and eventually her daughter. She cared for them both with so much

love and was their advocate and dedicated caregiver. Rosetta had a strong bond with Blessed Casey Salanus and made several trips to St Bonaventures. She would give the small badges of Fr Salanus to anyone who was sick or struggling. Two weeks ago I sent 3 badges to her in a card and she called me and said she already passed them to 3 people and asked me to pray for them. I came across a handwritten letter that Rosetta had written to me when she left orthopaedics. She expressed thanks to me and Trym for believing in her. She told me how much she valued being part of the Beaumont family and would "treasure in memory" all the years we worked together. Long after she came to lunches and parties and her presence was treasured. Her huge hugs and encouraging words and all the stories she could tell better than any of us were so uplifting. Well done Rosetta you impacted so many. You were a testimony of what a friend should be. You will be remembered by so many and you will always be in my prayers and heart!❤️. " I love you girl"
