Shepard, Sharon L. Nee Nadeau Died Monday, September 25 surrounded by her husband, and daughters at the age of 61. She was a loving wife, mother, grandma, sister, and aunt. Born and raised in Toledo, Ohio, she graduated from McAuley High School in 1963 and then from the University of Toledo in 1977. Later, in 1985 she moved with her family to Shelby Twp. “ Dear Family and Friends of Sharon, My name is Tom Nowak and I was a classmate of Sharon’s at St. Vincent de Paul grade school in Toledo. When I read the obituary in the Toledo Blade, I was sad to hear the news but I was not certain it was the Sharon I knew. Today I talked to Dick and learned that she was indeed my classmate. It was very sad to hear that her death came so unexpectedly and so quickly. Perhaps her passing was a blessing for her physically but not so for her mentally or her family and friends who must share her loss. I am sure her love will remain with all of you forever. I have nothing but fond memories of our grade school years. Despite some challenges, I think we were very fortunate. The first five years, we were in old wooden school buildings that were perhaps designed after WWII military barracks. As I recall, our tuition was free but we had to pay \$6.00 per year for textbooks. With so many pleasant memories, I will pass along a few. In what I hope was one of the earlier grades we were given a homework assignment to draw a map of the United States including naming all of the states. There were only 48 then. I am sure I worked hard on the assignment and was certain my map was perfect. Sharon sat next to me. With our maps on our desks, Sharon kindly reached over and told me that DC was over there! I looked at her as if to say “really?” She did not flinch. So I grabbed my eraser and moved our nation’s capital from the state of Washington to somewhere in the East. I was actually grateful for her help but I did not have a clue how she knew that. But I knew she was pretty smart so.. We were lucky to have very good teachers in grade school. All were Nuns except for the fifth grade. In the third grade “we” did something to make Sister lose control, yell out loud, and leave the room. We were stunned and afraid for what may follow. Whatever we did, I knew that I could have been part of the problem and in thinking back, I know that Sharon was innocent along with many others. The guilty ones were probably talking, giggling or chewing gum. All were major offenses in those days. After about 10 minutes, Sister came back, and resumed teaching as if nothing had happened. The guilty ones let out a sigh of relief. In the sixth grade, we moved into a brand new school building. Wow! What luxury!

Sister Mary Sacred Heart was our teacher and she was the greatest. Early in the year Mike asked, "Sister, does popcorn grow on trees?" After many moments of silence, Sister said something like "let's find out." Thereafter we used an empty classroom to set up an indoor farm and grew all sorts of "stuff." Corn was definitely included in the experiment. We ended up learning much and became famous in the process. The Blade came by, took many pictures and did a nice story in the magazine section. Great memories. In the seventh grade we first experienced how difficult life could be when our classmate Jeanne Ray had her leg amputated because of cancer. She died in the eighth grade. I am sure we all wondered how this could happen and why? In life, it is normal for family and friends to go in different directions. Some stay close. Some don't. It would have been so nice if Sharon and I could have kept in touch and shared our family experiences—the good times and the not so good. It was not meant to be. But we have our memories.
