Steve A. Schloff, age 61, of Gladwin, MI, formerly of Wixom, MI, passed away on Friday, February 4, 2011 at his residence. He was born February 11, 1949 in Detroit, the son of Donald and Frances England Schloff. Steve was a Vietnam Veteran of the United States Army Military Police in which he was awarded the National Defense Service Medal; Vietnam Service Medal with 4 Bronze Service Stars; Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal; Army Commendation Medal with 1 Oak Leaf Cluster; Bronze Star Medal; and Sharpshooter. On July 1, 2005 he married Toni Quinn in Farmington Hills. He was an avid football fan and enjoyed all types of music, especially early Rock and Roll and 50's music. He was preceded in death by his father, Donald Schloff. He is survived by his wife, Toni Quinn of Gladwin; mother, Frances Schloff of Sterling Heights; brothers, James Schloff of East Point and Mark Michelle Schloff of Madison Heights; sister, Barbara Eduardo Arrieta of Middletown, RI; step-children, Allison Jeffery Whitmer of Germantown, MD and Caitlin Ryan Ostby of Muskegon; and step-grandchildren, Quinn Whitmer and Madison Ostby.
