April 15, 1945 - July 11, 2024

Terrance Eugene Weiss, a resident of Clawson, died on Thursday, July 11, 2024, at the age of 79. Born on April 15, 1945 in Wilmington, Delaware to Ed and Mary O'Rourke Weiss. Terry dedicated his life to serving his country and his community. He served in the U.S. Army as a boatswain with the 1098th Transportation Company during the Vietnam War. When he returned home, Terry made his career as a police officer, spending 27 years as a patrolman with the City of Troy.

Terry had a passion for Sudoku and logic puzzles, loved a good laugh, and was always quick with a joke. He had a fondness for cowboy boots, convertibles, 7 and 7s, and John Wayne. He was a remarkable shot and loved skeet shooting with his kids and son-in-law. Terry enjoyed British mysteries and trying to solve all the world's problems. He also cherished his family deeply. At the beginning of every year he would spend an hour at Hallmark selecting birthday cards for each family member - a meaningful and loving tradition for him.

Terry also loved his pipe and would only smoke Captain Black in a white can. Known for his ability to fix anything with care and precision, he was a man of many talents and passions, leaving behind a legacy of dedication, service, and love.

“*Memories of Terry and I sharing what might seem to some as mundane or negligible times, could not be more cherished by me, as I reflect on them now. He was a wonderful big brother! I was his little ‘grease monkey’, as I would sit on the garage floor, washing off all the bits and parts (in a pan of gasoline) he would hand to me while working on all his cars, from “Clyde” to his little blue T-Bird. He explained every part, and what they were for, and how they worked. At 11 years old, I knew more about a combustion engine than many grown men, thanks to him! Terry was an excellent and generous teacher when sharing his knowledge of things he loved. I sat with him in his “closet work shop”, as he built his Kentucky rifle, showing me the mechanism of its workings, and even letting me pour the molten lead into molds, to make bullets for it, and standing behind me and catching me from getting knocked over when he let me shoot it! For one who often had a quick temper, he could just as easily be copiously patient! He was never bothered with me tagging after him, nosing in on his many interests and hobbies, allowing me to “help” with things, like his homing pigeons and teaching me how to care for them. He was kind and gentle with them and trained them well. I will never forget how upsetting it was, when a neighbor complained to the city so much, that he finally had to drive them away. He was heartbroken. Many years later, he chauffeured us from the church to our reception on my wedding day, with tremendous flair!*

Terry was a man among men. He was intelligent, artistic, dexterous, interesting and talented with strength and fortitude. But that’s not all... He was a loving father, brother, son, uncle... man... with a tender heart of gold.
