We are all saddened that you have passed on. Our memories, of the time spent with you will last forever. My memories are from the seventies when we were both in the military and worked at McGuire AFB. We did not carpool in the seventies. Each work morning you would fire up your Baracuda and I would fire up my Chevelle SS and we would race those cars from our apartment complex to the base on those back country roads. I remember VJ would catch up to us in his Super Bee. Those were very good times.

Then we all moved into base housing. Our kids grew up together and our families spent some much quality time living life. My Kids still remember the parade of Big Wheels through the court where we all lived. We both worked on the aircraft Flight line and most of our friends were the people we worked with and their families.

I remember when you had the Camaro. We worked on that car so that you could take it to the races on the weekend. You spent so much time with your pride & joy. You worked all week getting that car ready for the weekend races. I remember putting the Camaro on the trailer and driving into Philly late night weekends for some good street racing. You let me drive the Camaro one time and only one time. I will never forget it because even though you told me to go easy letting the clutch out, I let it out too fast and blew the rear drive assembly to pieces. To this day I still feel bad that I ruined that weekend of racing for you. We worked all the next week getting the car ready for the next weekend.

We had good times during those years, the cookouts, and trips to the Jersey Shore, going to Englishtown and most of all, our parties. It was the seventies my friend. We did have good parties.

When you decided your time with the military was coming to an end I remember hauling the Camaro on a trailer back to your parents' house. We only had the weekend to complete the round trip. We drove all night and arrived at your parents' house, they made us breakfast, and after putting the Camaro in a garage, we turned right around and drove back to Jersey. I still remember what we had for breakfast.

We stayed in touch after you left the service. I remember we drove

to your place in Michigan a few years after you got back home. As I remember it must have been Easter, the kids had Easter baskets from you and Cindy, one of the hard boiled eggs from a basket must have dropped and for months my van had this odor that I could not get rid of. Found a hardboiled Easter egg months later that had rolled under one of my cabinets. We all had a good laugh about that.

When I ended up living in Southern California, you and Cindy came out for a visit just after New Years. We went to see the Rose Bowl Floats, Hollywood, and the Beach Towns. We had some more good times my Friend.

Tim you may have passed, however the memories we have from the time you spent with all of us will forever live on within those left behind.

You were a good human being Tim Maluchnik. We will miss you. Bless you and your Family.
