He loved comedy shows and movies, and his natural humor made him king of the "dad jokes". Walter enjoyed reading books on history and solving all types of puzzles. He loved politics and keeping up with current events. His goofy, outgoing personality endeared him to friends, family, and even strangers. His special bond with his brother Tom was particularly remarkable; they were the best of friends who lived across the street from each other for over 52 years.
